 - Academic or work experience involving research

- Ability to use own initiative and to work independently, motivated by completing tasks and achieving results
- Attention to detail and accuracy; ability and willingness to present information objectively and impartially
- Interest in and general knowledge of international economic, social and cultural affairs, commitment to human rights and an equitable economy
